

## CANCELLATION OF CLASSES

- ◆ If public schools are cancelled or have early dismissal because of weather, faith formation sessions will also be cancelled.

## DISCIPLINE

We strive to maintain small classes where our catechists are able to give individual attention to each child. None of our *volunteer* catechists are expected to manage a class with a lot of disruptions from students. Any child who finds it difficult to be cooperative in class should ask to discuss matters with Mrs. Lang.

## EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

- ◆ In case of illness during class, parents will be called to come pick up their child.
- ◆ Emergency / fire drills may be conducted periodically during the year so that children will know where to go in case of an emergency. Parents will be notified to pick up their children in case of a building emergency.

## Welcome to St. Joseph Cathedral

Faith formation begins within the family, and our parish faith formation classes are a support for the foundation that is provided by the family in the home. Participation in the parish classes is only one piece of your child's faith formation.

**Faith formation is a life long process that includes involvement in the life of the parish. Your active presence here at St. Joseph Cathedral strengthens and affirms the whole church community that we are all welcomed into through baptism.**

### What you can do:

We ask for your cooperation as parents and as the primary teachers of your children in the ways of the faith in:

- ◆ **Faithful participation in weekend Mass with your children.**
- ◆ **Attendance at parent sessions.**
- ◆ **Participation in the sacrament of Reconciliation with your children.**
- ◆ **Praying with your children at home and teaching them the basic prayers of our faith.**
- ◆ **Giving as much priority to faith formation as you give to other activities of your children.**
- ◆ **Cooperation in matters of discipline.**
- ◆ **Parent volunteering is welcome.**

## REGISTRATION

- ◆ Your family must be registered in St. Joseph Cathedral Parish.
- ◆ You must complete a Faith Formation Registration Form before your child may begin sessions.
- ◆ Fees are \$40 for the first child, \$20 for each additional child with \$100 maximum per family payable at registration. There is a \$30 retreat fee for high school students.
- ◆ Scholarship funds are available if needed.

## MEETING TIMES

- ◆ Grades 1-5 meet once a month at the Boys & Girls Club immediately following the 8:30 a.m. Mass until 11:00 a.m.
- ◆ Grades 6-8 meet once a month at the Cathedral Library.
- ◆ Parents of children in grades 1-8 meet at the Boys & Girls Club while the children meet for class on Sunday mornings. Formation materials are given to parents to complete at home with their children during the weeks between classes.
- ◆ High School classes meet 5:00-6:45 p.m., prior to the 7:00 p.m. Mass with gatherings in the Church Hall.
- ◆ The First Reconciliation/First Eucharist sessions meet during 8:30 a.m. Mass on Sundays and continue at the Boys & Girls Club until 11:00 a.m..



## SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

### *Eucharist and Reconciliation:*

Preparation for these sacraments usually occur in second grade. The Sunday morning classes are centered around the 8:30 Mass. Sessions are held at the Boys & Girls Club, 555 Union St. and the Cathedral Library from 9:30-11:00 am. The program requires parent sessions and two parent/child retreat mornings. Check the class calendar for specific dates.

*Confirmation:* Candidates for Confirmation participate in our high school Youth Ministry sessions. Students complete a preparation course and retreat experience prior to reception of the sacrament. Teens may be confirmed in grade 10 or older in high school.

## ATTENDANCE

1. Attendance is recorded at every session and maintained on your child's Permanent Record Card.
2. An inordinate number of absences may result in delay in a child's reception of a sacrament, or repetition of a grade level.
